The Words and Work of Basket Maker Julia Parker

Deborah Valoma has woven a thoughtful blend of engaging narrative and scholarly research. The heart of her text reflects the life, the community and the work of national treasure and famed basket weaver, Julia Parker (Coast Miwok/Kashia Pomo). The writing shines through the thoughts and experiences that Julia expresses. Her eloquent yet simple words speak for themselves and remind us of our connection with the natural world:

"So when we gather, we are always told to give offering - no matter what we have. If I have money or if I am sitting there eating strawberries, I just throw one out there. That is paying back to the earth with the respect of a thank-you. So you follow all those rules. You don't take more than you need. And you do song, prayer, and offering. It is about knowing the plants - feeling close to the plants - that they are your friends."
